### Teacher Instructions

*Count and Collect* is a great active learning activity for students who are:

- learning and practising basic counting skills
- learning key numeracy skills
- practising organising information
- keen on moving around to learn

*Count and Collect* involves the student counting and finding various objects. Please ensure the areas they will be using are safe to do so and that items collected are either returned or are not needed. If necessary change the item to suit your resources or to suit the student.
